DAY'S PLAY

Competitive games are played on Thursdays. Games will be chosen by the Day's Play chairman and announced when groups are drawn. Games to be determined by number of players that day.

Games for Thursdays Days Play

Best Nine – Use your best 9 holes. Use ½ of your handicap.

Blind Holes – Pro shop will select 9 holes after all players have teed off.
Use ½ of your handicap.

Cha Cha or Cha Cha Cha - Teams of either three or four players. Play your own ball throughout the round. 1st hole use one best net score, 2nd hole use two best net scores. Then rotation starts over for Cha Cha. For four players use 1, 2 and 3 net scores before the rotation starts over in Cha Cha Cha.

Crier's Tournament - each player picks 3 worst holes and revert those scores back to par.

Hidden Holes – Pro shop select 3 holes to be removed after the match. All players discard same 3 holes. Best net score for 15 holes wins.
Low Gross – Low Net - two winners

Lucky Fours – total all par 4's. Use $\frac{1}{2}$ handicap.

Points - 8 for eagle, 6 for birdie, 4 for par, 2 for bogey. Use net scores.

Points for Putts – Chip in = 5 pts, 1 putt = 3 pts, 2 putt = 1 pt. 3 or more = minus 2 points.

Best Ball/Blind Draw – 2 players best net score on each hole.

Blind Partners – Partners will be drawn after the game. Total net of both players.

Odd and Even – 2 players, one takes even and other takes odd holes. Use $\frac{1}{2}$ of each player handicap for total net score.

Nines – teams of three. Total of 9 pts per hole. 5 pts for low net, 3 pts for second, and 1 pt. for last. Ties for first place get 4 points each, 1 pt. for last. Tie for second and third would be 2 pts each 5 for first. 3 pts if all three tie.

Poison Ball – teams of 3. Players take turns to use the colored (poison) ball. The poison ball score is used. If the poison ball is lost during play the team forfeits.

Chairman – lowest net score on the first hole becomes the chairman and receives 1pt. Only get points if you are the chairman.

Left/Right – teams are determined by their location on each hole. Best net score of each hole gets a point (one point for each team member).

Fairways – Player receives 1 point for every fairway drive.

Whack & Hack – teams of 4 players, lowest and highest net score is added together for each hole.

2 CLUB and BIRDIE CLUB

To become a member of 2 club, you must make a two on a hole, be playing with a current member and be invited to join. To become a member of the Birdie club, you must make a birdie on a hole, be playing with a current member, and must be invited to join.

When you join either club, you must pay \$1.00 to each two-club member in your group. After that, each time you get a two on a hole you will receive a \$1.00 from each two-club member in your group. If you are a member of the birdie club you will receive \$0.25 from each birdie member in your group.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE GEARHART LADIES' GOLF CLUB

Article I

This Club is be known as the "Gearhart Ladies' Golf Club."

Article II

Purpose:

- a. To promote the game of golf among women.
- b. To encourage friendly and cooperative feelings among the members.

Article III

1. Meetings and Officers
 - a. Meetings to be held the first Thursday of March, May, August, October and December at the Gearhart Golf Links. Times to TBA depending on the activity of the day. Date of meeting can be changed by the club president if there is at least one week's notice to each member, either in person, by phone, or group email.
 - b. Additional meetings may be called at the discretion of the President.
 - c. Officers to be elected as follows: President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
2. Duties of Vice President - Assist the President when called upon, conduct meetings in her absence, and chair the audit committee.
 - a. Secretary - Keep minutes, records, and correspondence.
 - b. Treasurer - Pay bills, and deposit or withdraw money.
3.
 - a. Election of Officers of officers will take place at the October Meeting.
 - b. Nominations will come from the floor.
 - c. Officers will be introduced at the October luncheon.

Article IV

1. Days Play for Thursdays will be entered in the calendar of events.
2. USGA Rules and local golf club rules to be followed for competitive play.
3. New members must establish a USGA handicap within three months of joining the Ladies' Club.
 - a. Until handicap is established the member will receive a maximum handicap of 40.
 - b. Junior golfers are always welcome as a guest.
- 4.. Guests are welcome on "Ladies Day", but do not compete for Prizes.

Article V

1. Dues
 - a. Yearly dues payable in January of each year.
 - b. No member may play for prizes if dues are not paid.

Article VI

Funds – The bank account should have sufficient funds at the first of the year, after dues are paid, to cover the club budget.

Article VII

1. The constitution may be amended by the following procedure:
 - a. Written proposal submitted at a regular meeting and voted upon at the following scheduled meeting.
 - b. A favorable 2/3 vote of the quorum is needed to adopt the amendment.
 - c. The quorum will consist of 1/4 of the current membership.

Procedures:

1. A \$2.00 fee for Thursday play will be paid to the pro-shop prior to start of play.
2. Pairing will be done by the DPC.
3. Prize money will be paid to the winners at the next game day.
4. Results will be posted on the bulletin board or on GroupMe
5. Ec Cards - priority days are Tuesday and Thursday.
6. To be eligible to participate in the Club Championship you must have played in three previous Day's Play.

The Club Tournament to be held in August. Tournament is to be for 36 holes.

Above dates are flexible depending upon weather or other activities of the club.

A hosted luncheon and awards presentation will be held on the last day of the tournament.

2023 Ladies' Club dues are \$40.00, 2023 OGA Handicap dues are \$35, and 2023 Hole in One Club is an optional fee of \$5.00

HANDICAPPING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES OF THE GLGC.

The Handicap Committee of Gearhart Ladies' Golf Club is responsible for ensuring compliance with the obligations under the World Handicap System in accordance with the Rules of Handicapping and the USGA. As a committee, we will verify that acceptable scores are posted for handicap purposes and made available for peer review. The committee will perform random score audits and review members scoring record at least annually.

In addition, the Handicap Committee provides guidance to club officials to ensure players consistently can use their Handicap Index to compete, or play a casual round, with anyone else on a fair and equal basis.

The Handicap Committee members are Peggy Cole, Marie Gann, Mindy Pentilla, Lori Scott, Barbara Wascher and Sue Olson. The Handicap committee has set forth the following policies and procedures for all members wishing to establish and maintain a Handicap Index with our club.

- Maintain an active handicap. If an index is not kept at Gearhart Golf Links the member will

 - provide the name and phone number of the chairperson where the handicap is kept.

 - Post all acceptable rounds, including 9-hole rounds.

- Where applicable, proper adjustments must be applied to all scores for posting purposes,

 - Including net par, net double bogey, most likely score or maximum score.

- Each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played.

What is an Acceptable Score?

- If 14 or more holes are played in an 18-hole round

- If 7 holes are played on a rated 9-holes

- Scores are to be posted within the same day of the round being played

- Scores made under Rule 3.2 when a hole is not played

- Scores made under Rule 3.3 when a player does not hole out

- Scores made if a player is disqualified from a competition but has an acceptable score

 - Scores made when played by the Rules of Golf

 - Scores made when played on a course during its active season

 - Scores made in the company of a least one other person, who can also act as a marker.

All acceptable scores are to be posted within the same day of play using one of the following methods:

Score posting kiosk at the golf course

Mobile App

Returned to golf shop/Handicap Committee for posting

Disciplinary Actions for failure to post or player manipulating their Handicap Index.

1. First failure to post or potential manipulation of your score will result in a verbal warning
2. Second failure will result in a written warning
3. Third failure will result in the appropriate penalty round issued for scores not posted
4. After your fourth failure to post your score or continued manipulation of the score file, further disciplinary action will be taken as the Handicap Chair and Committee deems fair and equitable

A player must earn a Handicap Index. No player has an inherent right to a Handicap Index demonstration ability to our golf club's Handicap Committee. The Handicap Committee has the authority and obligation to adjust a Handicap Index if it feels necessary to do so.
